ACE has reviewed Teaching Channel/Learners Edge coursework for transfer credit and will award credit, as appropriate. Approved Teaching Channel/Learners Edge courses are transcribed as graduate-level, continuing education credit at ACE. Course transfers are documented with a letter grade and posted on a student's ACE transcript.

ACE offers credit pathways for Teaching Channel/Learners Edge course completers who meet ACE program admission requirements to transfer between six (6) and nine (9) credits toward the focus of study or elective areas in numerous ACE M.Ed. and Ed.D. programs.
